L1- LO: Why was it called the Victorian era?	It was called the Victorian era because the Queen was Victoria.
L2- LO: What were classrooms like in the Victorian era?	Victorian classrooms had small benches and lift up desks. There was a map of the world and a picture of Queen Victoria at the front of the room. They had chalk boards and sat in rows.
L3- LO: What were English lessons like in the Victorian era?	English lessons contained writing practise and spelling. Children had to know how to spell lots of words from memory and practised witting using a copy book on a slate or using a quill and ink.
L4- LO: What was a Victorian school day like?	A Victorian school day started at 9am and finished at 5pm. Children were taught the 3Rs (reading, writing and arithmetic). Children didn't have a morning break but did have a 2-hour lunch where they went home to eat.
L5- LO: What punishments were there in a Victorian school?	Children were punished with lashes from a cane, by wearing a dunce's hat or by being put in a cage.
